LOCAL BOAT RUN RAISES BIG \$\$ FOR SURVIVORS Ruth's House staff was invited

Haulin' A\$\$ on the Pamlico, an annual boat run from Washington to Belhaven, known for raising money for local charities, chose Ruth's House to be the benefactor of their gracious generosity this year.

The decision in supporting our efforts in ending domestic violence stemmed from the tragic events that occurred in Aurora on January 21, 2020. 25-year-old Alisha Marie Morgan, mother and beloved family member was murdered by her 1 y.o. child's father. Ruth's House staff was invited to attend a reception the evening before and were able to speak with the Aunt of Ms. Alisha. The nearly \$7,000 raised will be used to directly assist survivors in escaping and living an abuse free life.


